
The workshop is a FREE benefit of membership but is limited to fifteen people. Pre-registration is

The girl in the white dress in the photograph on the left is my great-grandmother, Lela Ann, with her parents Ebenezer LOVELESS and Eliza ROGERS. Lela Ann Loveless was born in Faulkner County, Arkansas, in 1896. Her family later moved to Stephenville, Erath County, Texas. Although all census records indicate that Ebenezer was a farmer, he also was a minister. I have a newspaper photo showing him baptizing adults in a river. Lela Ann married George Warren LANCASTER in 1912. They had four children, one of whom is my 95-year-old grandmother, who I have always called Mam-ma. Mam-ma and my mother, Lea Nell, came to California after World War II. They are shown in the second photograph in the matching clothes that my grandmother made. These two photos are the four generations before me.
