




CGS Ancestors

Photo Tributes to the CGS Family

Above is a picture of my uncle, Charles Schroeder. I recently found this photograph and I am submitting it in tribute to his father and my grandfather, Henry Diedrich Schroeder. Grandpa Henry was born November 7, 1878 in Brooklyn, New York. He married Annie Schneider and fathered thirteen children between 1904 and 1920. In 1911 when he registered with the draft board he was a chauffeur living at 113th Street, Richmond Hill, New York. In the 1920 census Grandpa Henry was enumerated "engineer in a brewery" and in 1930 he was a traffic cop for the Long Island Railroad. After Annie died Henry went into business with his youngest son, Charles. Their company sterilized beer pipes in the neighborhood bars, taverns and saloons. Grandpa Henry and Uncle Charles lived and worked from one address, 119-20 Jamaica Ave., Richmond Hill, New York. In 1941, at the start of another war, Grandpa Henry once again registered with the local draft board at age 63. Henry Diedrich Schroeder died on November 2, 1949. I was born a few years before he died, but I don't have any memory of Grandpa Henry. Now I know a little more about him and it makes me very happy.
