Photo Tributes to the CGS Family

This month, we pay tribute to Florence Randolph Jackson Lee, grandmother of Lisa B. Lee.



Florence Randolph Jackson Lee (1884-

1965) was born in Jersey City, New Jersey, one of three daughters of Charles Kersey JACKSON and Mary Luvisa BRUCE. The Jacksons were an affluent black family who owned The Robinson House, a hotel in Niagara Falls, New York. After Florence graduated from the Pratt Institute in Brooklyn, New York in 1908, she worked for a designer on Fifth Avenue in New York City as a modiste - a fashionable dressmaker or milliner.

Florence married Edward David LEE in 1917 in Niagara Falls and the newlyweds settled in nearby Buffalo, New York where Florence co-founded the Lit-Mus Study Club in 1922. (The name is a contraction of the terms "literature" and "music" and is pronounced Lit-MUSE.) The group started with a nucleus of 21 women and a mission "to study history, sociology, civic, literature, music, and any other subject chosen to improve our community and to promote sociability among out members." Eighty-eight years later it is the oldest active affiliate of the National Association of Colored Women's clubs in Buffalo and continues a tradition of service to the community that spans more than three quarters of a century. - Lisa Lee
