California Ancestors

Photo Tributes to the CGS Family

This month, we pay tribute to Lois Elling's family enjoying a gathering at the Robinson family home.



This is my grandparent's home on Dochester Street in Los Angeles, November 1916. The house still stands but the address today is 2725 West 15th Street.

At the top of the steps is my grandmother, Caroline Persson Robinson holding my aunt, Alice; my grandmother's sister, Anna, with husband, Carl Persson; my father, Herman Robinson, age 4 1/2; and grandmother's other sister, Ella, with husband Andrew Carlson. Standing at the right is my grandfather, William Robinson, Jr., who took the photograph and hand-colored it with tints that were applied just like paints.

The three sisters - Caroline, Anna and Ella - came from Sweden. Ella died in the 1918 flu epidemic. Anna and Carl later returned to Sweden.

My grandfather Robinson was interested in photography and I'm sure he set up the camera himself and probably made the print. I don't think he had much talent for hand-tinting pictures, though, and this is one of the few that he did. His interest in photography was passed down to both his children, and also to me.
