#### **Charles J. Freeman (1909 - 2012)**

San Francisco native Charles J. Freeman, 82, died at his home in Novato, California, on May 6, 2012. He held a Master's in Library Science from USC and was the librarian at San Rafael High School for many years, until his



retirement in 1990. Charles was a longtime member of the California Genealogical Society. He joined CGS in 1992 and for a time was a frequent visitor to the library who participated in the New York research group. His <u>obituary was published</u> in the *San Francisco Chronicle* on May 14, 2012.

This month, CGS member Virginia Kysh, honors her husband's great-grandmother Hannah Marie (Job) Avery.



Hannah Marie Job Avery - aka "Fannie H. Avery"

Hannah Marie Job was born in San Francisco, 7 August 1860. She was the daughter of Pierre Marie Julien Job, a respected French chef, baker and San Francisco restaurant owner, and Christiana Fraser. At the age of eighteen she married George H. Avery, a native of Melrose, Massachusetts, who came to San Francisco before he was two years old.

Little was known of Hannah until I found her biography on Google Books in Ella Sterling Cummins' The Story of the Files: A Review of Californian Writers and Literature, 1893.

I learned Avery was a writer and poet who wrote for the San Francisco Evening Post and San Francisco Newsletter.

"She was a talented and pretty little brown-eyed woman, spoke French fluently and sang Scotch ballads with taste and expression, was modest and unassuming. She attempted to support herself and children, and succumbed at the age of 27, December, 1887."
