This month we honor Thomas Lee Rader and Louise Douglas Mackintosh, maternal great-grandparents of California Genealogical Society President Jeffrey Vaillant.



Thomas Lee Rader and Louise Douglas Mackintosh

Thomas Lee Rader was born 16 February 1883 in Jeffersonville, Indiana. He died in 3 September 1951, in Chicago, Illinois.

Louise Douglas Mackintosh was born 18 May 1887 in Des Moines, Iowa. She died 28 April 1962, in San Leandro, California.

Thomas and Louise were married 3 March 1909. It was her first marriage and his fourth. Thomas experienced far more than his share of tragedy. By the time of his marriage to Louise, at the age of 27, he had been widowed twice, divorced, and had also buried three children and his father.

Thomas' career was with the telephone company in various capacities over the years.
