**Annual Business Meeting and Social Hour** 





This month, we honor the Dartt Brothers of Mendocino, family of CGS member Nyla Urch-Dartt.



The Dartt Brothers

The Dartt brothers, natives of Nova Scotia, Canada, migrated to Mendocino County, California, to work in the logging industry as timber cutters, each within a year of his 18th birthday. After the area was "logged out" the brothers remained in California. Samuel owned a lumber company in Oakland. Robert became a rancher on the Navarro Ridge. Frederick retired from Mendocino State Hospital of Ukiah after many years of service. My grandfather, Joseph Howe Dartt, took employment at a PGE substation in Vacaville.

In the photograph, the brothers are standing in front of a backdrop, wearing the clothing and faces of "The Wild West" as celebrated in Fort Bragg, Mendocino County, California, yearly, to this day. They are (l. to r., standing) Joseph Howe Dartt (b. 1862) [smoking cigar] and Frederick Dartt (b. 1857); (l. to r. sitting) Robert Dartt (b. 1853) and Samuel Kent Dartt (b. 1852).
