In honor of St. Patrick's Day, we pay tribute to Irish-born Jennie McCormick Fitzgerald, great-grandmother of member Cathy Paris.



Jennie McCormick Fitzgerald (1861 - 1935)

My great-grandmother, Jennie McCormick Fitzgerald, was one of fourteen children of Cornelius McCormack, carpenter and wheelwright, of Cahiriscooba, near Newmarket-on-Fergus in County Clare, Ireland. About 1882, Jennie joined her sister, Lizzie, in Concord, New Hampshire where she worked in the laundry room of the New Hampshire State Hospital. In 1883, Jennie married James E. Fitzgerald, a first-generation American with a lakefront farm in Andover, New Hampshire.

Jennie was a "hell on wheels" according to her son-in-law, my grandfather, Fred Merrill. She needed to be tough. By 1919, about the time this photograph of Jennie was taken, she was fifty-eight years old and had been running the farm for some time. She had witnessed the deaths of her husband and four of her seven children. James Sr. had been dead about three years. James Jr. died at age sixteen from diabetes and Dan died at age eighteen after falling through the ice on the lake. Annie succumbed to diabetes at age nine and Mary to Spanish Influenza when she was thirty-two. In addition to running the farm, my tough great-grandmother also took in laundry and did ironing for the women in town. Jennie ran the farm until 1928.

This summer, in remembrance of Jennie and James and others that have come and gone, we are holding a

family reunion on the Old Fitzgerald Farm, now Bluewater Farm.
