California Ancestors: They Lived Here, There, and Everywhere!

Photo Tributes to the CGS Family

This month we honor **James Beatty**, fourth great-grandfather and favorite ancestor of volunteer and former director, Sandra Jones Fryer.



James Beatty b. abt. 1800, County Tyrone, Ireland, d. 19 May 1883, Brooklyn, New York

James Beatty is one of my favorite ancestors, in part because I am lucky enough to have his image. His granddaughter, my great-great grandmother Francis Mudge Elliott, kept a "Photograph Family Record" that was passed down to me. In addition to many other family pictures and specific notes on family births, marriage, and deaths, the album holds this 2.25 by 3.5 inch photograph in brown sepia mounted on a mat. "Grandfather Beatty" was handwritten on the back where there is a photographer's nameplate, "Jordan & Co. (late Bogardus), 229 Greenwich Street, Established 1846."

James was married in New York City in 1821 and made his initial naturalization filing as an innkeeper in 1822. In later census records I learned he was in the wholesale grocery business and fairly affluent. I suspect he came to New York with some savings and was not a completely self-made man. Ironically, there

was another James Beatty living in New York about the same time who was also in the grocery business. The second James Beatty was born in the U.S. so their birth locations have helped me separate their identities.
