

**Ancestor Tribute**

Honoring Hispanic Heritage Month

Since I was a little girl, my mother told me of an oval photograph that was in her grandfather's house in Moca, Puerto Rico. It was a woman seated in a long skirt, white blouse, holding a fan. She asked her grandfather who she was - "That's your grandmother". For years I've heard about that photograph, and finally had a chance to get an image of it from my cousin Diana Cardona.

Born in 1863 in Aguadilla, Maria Concepcion Lopez Ramirez died on 3 January 1925 in Barrio Pueblo, Moca, Puerto Rico. She was the daughter of Buenaventura Lopez de Segura y Sosa and Olivia Antonia Ramirez Jimenez of Aguadilla. She married Ambrosio Alicides Babilonia Talavera (1860-1951) about 1878, and had twelve children with him between 1878-1897, eleven of whom survived to adulthood.

In January 1925, Maria Concepcion was ill, rose from her bed and asked to use a commode, which at that time was in a chair. There she died of a massive heart attack, and my grandfather sent for the photographer, knowing it was his only chance



to get an image of his wife. Her hands and dress were carefully arranged. This is why her face is slightly altered, probably to give the impression that she was still alive at the time the photograph was taken that day. Although her specific features are rendered slightly indistinct, I can see her round face, still present across the members of my mother's family.
