Additionally, we will offer consultations throughout the day. Researchers are invited to visit the library free of charge. 


history of the organization that has helped thousands of people compile their own family histories!"

April Fools by Lorna Wallace



Keep the old photos, but cull those boxes of silly expressions before future generations get control.

Left to right: my great grandparents, Jane "Jenny" Lines Finch and George Gale. Then James Gale and Clino Sophia Dimitry, plus an unidentified young man. It appears they were getting a casual portrait at a "pre-photograph" photo (ambrotype?), c. 1878-1880, likely taken near their domiciles, either Connecticut or New Orleans.

This image was going to be my token to April Fool's Day rather than a tribute. I know this wasn't a flattering likeness. But, like most of you, I couldn't make fun of cherished ancestors I'd never met. And so my message: snapshots were so common recently, weed through them for posterity's sake!

Great grandmother, Jane, had very long Connecticut roots. She died of tuberculosis barely a decade after this moment leaving three daughters. (They can be seen in the <u>August 2013 CGS</u> <u>eNews Photo Tribute</u>.)

The Gale brothers immigrated from Douglas, Isle of Man, to the U.S. George was a ship's carpenter for N Y, New Haven & Hartford RR in Hartford, CT, and John was a sea captain out of New Orleans. Clino Sophia Dimitry, namesake of my grandmother, was from a long line of Southerners.
